

WARRENS CRANBERRY FESTIVAL

The Cranberry Festival in Warrens is celebrating their 38th year. The livelihood of the residents in this area depends largely on the cranberry crop. The Warrens area cranberry marshes harvest an average of 285 million pounds of cranberries every year. Whether you use cranberries for sauces, jellies, relishes, or for stringing on the Christmas tree, there are many booths in which to purchase cranberries or cranberry products throughout the day.

More than 100 vendors with fall produce will gather together, offering pumpkins, dried flowers, flavored honey, Amish noodles, apples, onions, cabbage and of course fresh cranberries and cranberry products.

Over 350 antique and flea market booths participate with everything from depression glass, fishing and hunting supplies, purses, collectibles, toys, gloves and socks, jewelry, sunglasses, crocks, leather, sports cards and so much more.

Boasting over 850 Arts and Crafts booths, the festival is a great place to do some early Christmas shopping. Each booth is picked for its unusual and interesting craft. Crafters gather from all over the country to showcase their talents at the Festival.

With over 1,300 booths covering more than three miles of booth frontage - you can *"Shop 'til you Drop!"*

There is a tour of the cranberry marsh and Ocean Spray processing plant available at Warrens. You can sign up for it upon arrival.
